## THE RESOURCE DIRECTORY

The Khayelitsha Services Directory is funded by the National Development Agency (NDA) as part of a unique partnership project between the NDA and various organisations operating in Khayelitsha and Mitchell's Plain as Urban Renewal sites. It is published

by the Western Cape Networking AIDS Community of South Africa (WC-NACOSA). It is hoped that this Directory will be a useful tool for the many organisations working in the Khayelitsha area and will contribute towards better coordination and sharing of knowledge and resources.

WC-NACOSA's overall goal is "to reduce the impact of HIV/AIDS through building capacity, networking and strengthening the multi-sectoral response to HIV/AIDS and TB in the Western Cape Province."

As umbrella organisation of the more than 300 HIV/AIDS organisations in the Western Cape, WC-NACOSA plays a pivotal role in disseminating relevant information to our network. It is done by means of a quarterly newsletter, database and response to enquiries.

WC-NACOSA's quarterly meetings and district forums are examples of the several fora and meetings in the Metro as well as Rural districts the organisation is hosting and supporting. 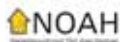

## Introduction

Civil society organisations often do the most amazing work in the most trying circumstances. Despite the shortage of funding, lack of resources, dangerous working conditions in poverty stricken communities and a sense of isolation in the fight against poverty, HIV/AIDS and TB organisations still forge ahead. This should be acknowledged, celebrated but also act as a yard stick on which improvements needs to be based. WC-NACOSA has long been concerned with the lack of coordination of services at district level and within communities, as well as the lack of support and information to community organisations. Support of the MSAT initiative in Cape Town is critical due to the coordination, networking and promoting dialogue role the MSAT is meant to fulfill at community and district level. The purpose of this resource directory is to fulfill the WC-NACOSA objectives of coordination, networking and promotion of dialogue via the support of the Khayelitsha MSAT.

It is hoped that the directory will provide organisations with the necessary information on TB, and HIV/AIDS in order to answer the common questions asked of fieldworkers on a daily basis. The directory also strives to connect organisations to each other by listing organisations operating in Khayelitsha and their services to facilitate appropriate referrals.

Although WC-NACOSA strived to produce a comprehensive directory of organisations and services, it is inevitable that there will be omissions and mistakes due to constantly changing information and human error. For that we apologise. Please bring those to our attention and it will be corrected. It is hoped to produce an updated directory in the future.

If your organisation provides services within the community of Khayelitsha and is not listed in this directory, please supply those details to WC-NACOSA so that it can be added to our database. Likewise, if there are any corrections to be made, please let us know. Any comments and feedback would also be appreciated.

This project is funded by the NDA for Khayelitsha and Mitchell's Plain as Urban Renewal sites. It is envisioned that a similar directory will be produced for Mitchell's Plain. Organisations operating in Mitchell's Plain are requested to send their information to WC-NACOSA to ensure inclusion in that directory.

# Multi-sectoral action teams (MSAT)

The multi-sectoral approach provides comprehensive action that addresses the symptoms as well as the underlying factors fuelling the HIV/AIDS/TB epidemic, hence the inclusion of all CBOs, FBOs, NGOs, government and the business sector as stakeholders and role-players in the community.

## Why multi-sectoral action teams?

Because previous approaches to HIV/AIDS/TB:

- failed to address HIV/AIDS/TB holistically – they addressed only medical aspects of HIV/AIDS/TB. As such, HIV/AIDS/TB was considered to be a problem for the Health Department only.
- addressed only the symptoms and not the underlying causes.
- hampered the efficacy of programmes due to duplication, poor coordination, and poor awareness of existing services addressing HIV/AIDS/TB and related factors.

## MSAT objectives

- To network and coordinate HIV/AIDS/TB activities at a sub-district level.
- To develop targeted interventions to address sub-districts' HIV/AIDS/TB needs.
- To assist and monitor the implementation of sub-district HIV/AIDS/TB initiatives.

## MSAT role

- Facilitating and co-ordinating community based activities and responses to HIV/AIDS/TB and underlying factors;
- Encouraging co-ordination and utilisation of existing services;
- Identifying local needs and developing projects to meet these needs;
- Endorsement of project proposals submitted for funding;
- Monitoring and evaluation of service delivery.

Khayelitsha, meaning “new home” was established in 1983 to accommodate overcrowding in Crossroads, Nyanga, Langa and Gugulethu. While many of these inhabitants chose not to relocate, people from other areas moved to Khayelitsha and soon the demand for homes as well as sites (with or without services) was so great that informal areas without basic services (including water and sanitation) mushroomed. Twenty years after being established, Khayelitsha was home to nearly 400 000 people.\*

Khayelitsha is an area of multiple problems – regardless of the measures used; it has among the worst social and economic problems in Cape Town and, in deed, in the country as a whole.

Housing and health, safety and security, as well as job creation are priority issues for Khayelitsha and is reflected in the lack of formal housing, overcrowding and general dysfunctionality of the area.\*

There is widespread unemployment, only 34.6% of residents are in employment and, of those that are employed, only around 4% work in the Khayelitsha district.\*\* All others are very far from their places of work, in the inner city (24%), Bellville (30%) and southern suburbs (Claremont/Wynberg 29%). The social and economic consequences of this are substantial.

Along with poverty and the lack of facilities comes some of the highest rates of HIV/AIDS infection, as well as some of the highest crime and murder rates in the world.

Many residents retain a strong link to the Eastern Cape, travel there regularly, own property there and make regular payments to family members living in the rural areas. Importantly, various traditions continue. The role that social and economic groups such as stokvels (also known as “gooi-gooi”) have played in ensuring survival in new and frequently abject circumstances cannot be underestimated.\*\*\*

There have been a wide range of civil society-based organisations confronting poverty issues in the area. These organisations have been involved in a wide range of both social and economic initiatives, the majority of which have involved high levels of community participation. The diversity of these initiatives and the lack of an overall strategy has meant that many of them are narrow in their objectives and do not confront the structural problems relating to spatial separation and resource starvation in Khayelitsha in an holistic manner.

The living conditions in Khayelitsha have a serious impact on the rates of diseases in the area. Typically, overcrowding and poverty gives rise to diseases such as diarrhoea and parasitic diseases, tuberculosis and sexually transmitted diseases. They also give rise to family disintegration with increased violence and abuse of women and children.\*

Sanitation provision in Khayelitsha is mixed, according to the living conditions of the households. People living in formal housing have running water in their homes and water borne toilets, whilst most people living in the informal settlements use either communal facilities or none at all.

The poor sanitation in Khayelitsha is further aggravated by the ground conditions. The soil type is sandy and the water table is high, which limits the type of toilets that are suitable. Furthermore, the area is subjected to a heavy winter rainfall and strong winds, which lead to further transmissions of diseases.

The high density living in the informal settlement leaves limited space for infrastructures such as roads and storm water drainage. The implications of this are dramatic. A high presence of faecal contamination, a result of overflowing sewers or lack of toilet facilities in the informal settlements, leads to surface pollution and contamination of storm water systems.

Lack of proper management of storm water conduits waste, which also results in offensive odours and the spread of water borne disease like diarrhoea.\*\*

With these living conditions, it is hardly surprising that diarrhoea is the second highest cause of death in children under the age of 5 years, and the seventh highest cause of death among people of all ages in Khayelitsha.\*\*\*

This is very tragic, particularly as death from diarrhoea can be avoided when treated.

# Diarrhoea: *prevention and treatment*

## To prevent diarrhoea

Remember to do the following:

- Use clean drinking water: Always drink tap water. If there are no taps in your area, boil all water and let it cool before drinking it.
- Wash your hands before preparing foods and before eating.
- Rinse vegetables and fruit with clean water before eating them fresh.
- Cover unfinished cooked food that you keep for later and store it in a cool place. Flies spread germs and warm places help germs to grow faster. If you want to reheat cooked food you have stored, make sure to bring it to boiling point again to kill germs that might have grown in the mean time.
- Add a tablespoon of jik to your dishwater when washing dishes and when wiping your kitchen surfaces to ensure there are no germs. Let your dishes drip dry rather than wiping them dry.
- Clean sanitation: Make sure you wash your hands every time after going to the toilet. Where there are no toilets, make sure that the toilet wastes do not contaminate the drinking water.
- For women who are HIV positive, it is best to formula feed their babies. However, this is only better than breastfeeding if you have clean water and if you wash the bottle thoroughly every time before feeding your child.

## If you have diarrhoea

It is important to prevent dehydration – prevent the body from losing too much water while having diarrhoea. A simple glucose drink can save lives.

## How to make the glucose drink

- Fill a clean one-litre bottle with clean water.
- Use water from a tap, or boiled water if from a river.
- Add eight teaspoons of sugar.
- Add half a teaspoon of salt.
- Taste. It should taste like tears.
- Drink two large cups of this glucose drink after every loose stool you have, or after vomiting. Take small sips slowly.
- Give your baby one large cup of this glucose drink after every loose stool it has, or after vomiting.

# STIs: *prevention is better than cure*

- Despite a high incidence of HIV and STIs in Khayelitsha, people in the area are largely not using condoms. Of those that do, many use them only sometimes, even with the same partner. Using a condom only sometimes does not protect you from HIV or other STIs.
- Young women are engaging in sex at a very young age and with no protection. Many of those that are going to clinics for STIs do not want free HIV tests.
- There is a need to address the cultural stigma attached to sex within the community, families and couples.

Sexual abstinence offers many benefits, particularly for young men and women:

- Allows time for the person to explore who he/she is as an individual without the pressures of a sexual relationship.
- It is an opportunity to get to know him/herself better.
- Allows time to get to know their partner within a relationship. Helps develop a relationship that is based on care and trust.

## Condoms are effective

When used correctly and consistently:

- Condoms are safe and have no side-effects.
- Condoms are accessible and readily available.
- Condoms are easily initiated and discontinued.
- Condoms are the best method of protection for infrequent sexual intercourse.
- Condoms are multi-purpose:
  - they prevent pregnancy
  - they prevent STIs (including HIV transmission)
  - they reduce the risk of cervical cancer (reduced risk of HPV, genital warts and cervical dysplasia)

## Successful condom use

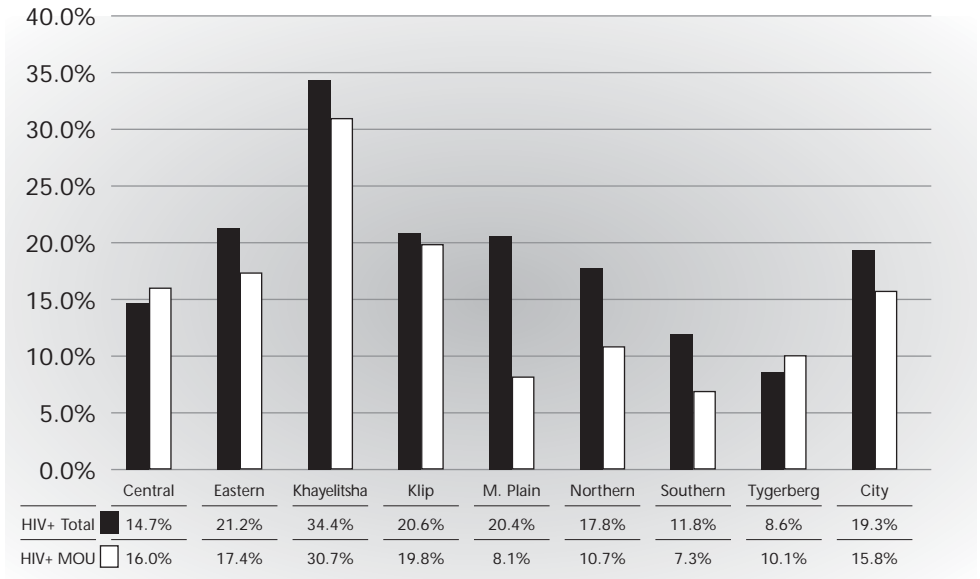
Requires:

- Partner participation and communication skills
- High level of motivation, confidence and self-control
- Knowledge of how to:
  - open the package
  - unroll before putting condom on
  - hold the rim before withdrawal, and
  - use only water-based lubricants (**not Vaseline**)

# HIV & AIDS

Khayelitsha has the highest prevalence of HIV in the Cape Town metropolitan district. The annual survey shows that 34.4% of pregnant women were HIV+. The prevalence of HIV continues to increase.

HIV prevalence in Cape Town sub-districts





Many people are afraid to get tested for HIV. Some people believe that if they have HIV then they will be very sick and die. But HIV, if properly treated, does not have to be a death sentence. People living with HIV are living long and happy lives. If you know your status you can improve your health by accessing medication and support.

People fear stigmatisation and discrimination from family or friends if they test positive but, remember, nobody needs to know your status except you. Counselling and support groups exist where you can find comfort and assistance.

HIV testing is available free of charge. Counselling is given before and after the test. All test results are strictly confidential. The test results are available within 20 minutes.

## **If your test is negative**

This means you do NOT have HIV.

- You should always use a condom each time you have sex to avoid contracting the virus.
- If you have recently had sex without a condom, you must go for another test 3 months later, as the virus might not have shown in the first test.

## **If your test is positive**

This means you have HIV. Finding out you have HIV can be difficult. At first, you might experience fear, anger and guilt. This is normal. But knowing your HIV status can help you improve your health.

- If you are HIV-positive you will be referred to an appropriate facility to have a clinical assessment and to set up a medical plan to meet your specific needs. You will be referred for antiretrovirals when it is necessary.
- You should learn more about the virus and how it affects your body.
- Try to eat enough and exercise.
- You must use a condom if you have sex.
- The counsellor will tell you about opportunistic infections – what they are and how to treat them.
- Counsellors will help you deal with the issue of disclosure and to understand your rights in this regard.
- If you are pregnant and have HIV, you should be able to get antiretroviral medicines at your clinic to reduce the risk of your baby getting HIV.
- Many years may pass between becoming HIV-positive and actually developing AIDS.

# Living with HIV *Maintaining health*

- It is important for all people to have a good level of nutrition. For people living with HIV and AIDS it is important to stay as healthy as possible to minimise opportunistic infections and to delay the progression of illness.
- People with HIV get diseases known as opportunistic infections. All clinics must offer treatments for opportunistic infections.
- Antiretroviral medicines can help people who develop AIDS to live long, healthy lives. They are a lifelong treatment, not a cure.
- Most people with HIV only need to take antiretrovirals after many years. Ask your clinic for a CD4 test. This will tell you how healthy your immune system is. If your CD4 count is near or below 200, you should start antiretroviral treatment.

## **Antiretrovirals (ARVs)**

Antiretrovirals are presently only issued as part of a comprehensive treatment package at the following three community health care (CHC) centres in Khayelitsha:

- Site B CHC
- Michael Mapongwana CHC
- Nolungile CHC

## **Referral**

You can be referred to any of these ARV clinics by a nurse or doctor at any of the primary health care clinics or CHCs once they have done: a full clinical assessment of your condition; a CD4 test if necessary; referred you for ongoing counselling as necessary; and have treated any opportunistic infections. When you are referred to an ARV clinic you must be given a referral letter to take with you on the day of your appointment.

## **Preparing for treatment**

At the ARV clinic you will get a full clinical assessment and you will speak to a counsellor and a nurse. You will be entered into a treatment readiness programme, which will ensure that you are ready to take antiretrovirals for the rest of your life. The emphasis is on understanding HIV, how to take care of yourself, information about the antiretroviral drugs and their possible side effects, where and when to access help and to support you as best as possible.

## **Support**

You will also join a support group, which will help you to cope with your illness and assist you in many other ways. The doctor will be trying to exclude any active opportunistic infections and making sure that you are ready for antiretrovirals.

## **Treatment ready**

At the end of the treatment readiness programme the team will decide whether you are ready to start antiretrovirals. If you are not yet ready they will do their best to get you ready as soon as possible.

## Starting Antiretrovirals

- Once you have been started on antiretrovirals you will be given dates to return to see the Doctor, the nurse, the pharmacist and the counsellor.
  - You will be monitored for side-effects of the drugs, which will include blood tests being taken.
  - You will have to collect your medication monthly.
  - You will be supported on a regular basis by the counsellors.
  - You will also know where and when to seek help if you should develop any infections as you will still be prone to infections in the early stages of antiretroviral treatment. It takes a while for your immune system to recover so you still have to take good care of yourself and seek help early if you are feeling ill.

Khayelitsha has a huge epidemic of TB. Anybody in Khayelitsha who is coughing a lot should be tested for TB. TB is caused by germs, NOT by cold and damp. The germs are spread very easily – every person who has untreated TB can infect 10 other people close to them.

It is important to get tested for TB for your own wellbeing and for the health and safety of those people close to you. If you are diagnosed with TB you will be put on a treatment course for 6 or 8 months to make sure that the germs are all killed.

**You must complete this course!** The medication must be taken every day without a break. If a person starts TB treatment and stops before the medication is finished, they can develop a new form of TB – TB that will resist medication. It is known as multi-drug resistant TB and it is very difficult and expensive to treat.

Also, if you are cured of the TB you will not be able to transmit TB to anyone else.

### Common symptoms

Include:

*If it is not treated correctly TB can be life-threatening*

The World Health Organisation recommends preventive treatment for vulnerable individuals with dormant TB, particularly children under 5 years of age who live with someone who has active TB or persons infected with HIV.

---



There are many organisations and groups of people who can help to raise a child. Some of these people may be close to the child, and some may be far from the child. They are all like Circles of Support around the child. In order to support children we need to understand:

- Children's rights
- Children's needs
- How to know when children need help

### How do we know if children need help?

- They don't get enough to eat
- They are often sick
- Sometimes they do not have school uniforms or school fees
- Maybe they cannot go to school
- They have to care for sick adults or brothers and sisters
- They have to do adult's work
- Sometimes they do not have the love and support of caring adults
- Maybe they have to live on the streets
- They live with stigma, discrimination or exploitation
- Sometimes they are treated badly by people around them
- They are often left alone
- Maybe they have a disability
- They are often very poor
- They may behave badly or differently

### Three circles working together

1. **The first circle of support** around the child is made up of the people closest to the child and his or her family like relatives, neighbours and friends. It is much better for children to be cared for in families than in institutions like orphanages. Helping the child often means helping his or her family as well.
2. **The second circle of support** comes from the community and is made up of community members close to the child. You may decide to join, or even create this Circle of Support to help children in need in your community. This second Circle can also provide help to the first Circle of Support.
3. **This third circle of support** is made up of organisations and government services that provide a specific support to children in need. They also want to help adults who are taking care of children in need. Some of these organisations may be far from the child, like AIDS Support Groups and businesses or home-based care organisations.

## **Ways organisations can help**

- Youth and church groups can help care for the sick, fight discrimination and look after children.
- Local AIDS support groups, like NAPWA, can give emotional help, care for the sick and fight stigma.
- NGOs like Hospice or Child Welfare Society can help children cope with sickness, death and abuse.
- Local businesses can sponsor food, clothes and school things.
- Local leaders can help to fight discrimination.
- Women's groups can help care for children or sick people and for families where there is abuse.
- Traditional leaders can help fight stigma and discrimination.
- Home-based care organisations can identify children in need. They can also help with training carers at home.

## **Ways the government can help**

- Local authorities may be able to help with funds.
- Local clinics and hospitals can help children who have sick parents. They may also give cleaning materials.
- Local social workers can counsel children who are unhappy or behaving badly.
- Caring teachers can look out for children in need and refer them for help.
- Teachers can organise a school feeding scheme.
- The S A Police can help fight abuse.
- The Department of Social Development has different government grants for families in need.



The Social Assistance Act makes provision for the following grant types:

- Grant for the Aged
- Foster Child Grant
- Grant for the Disabled
- Care Dependency Grant
- War Veteran's Grant
- Child Support Grant

## Grant for the Disabled

The disability grant is often misunderstood and only offers limited support to those too ill to work at all. The criterion for the grant are purely medical and social factors are not taken into consideration. Grants need to be renewed and even a permanent grant can be reassessed after 5 years.

### Qualifying criteria

- Disabled person attained the age of 18 years
- Disability confirmed by medical report (Regulations also make provision for an assessment panel)
- Assessment has to confirm whether disability is permanent or temporary
- Degree of disability is such that the person is incapable of entering labour market (i.e. is incapable of any work, not just the work that he/she was trained for)
- The person applying for grant does not (without good reason) refuse medical or other treatment recommended
- The grant applicant must be a South African citizen and Permanent RSA resident residing in SA at the time of application
- The person must comply with the means test (submit documentation to assess overall income and investments).

### General information

Department of Social Services attempts to process all applications for social assistance within 25 working days. In the Western Cape we currently have 1 official for every 1,200 beneficiaries. This was worse a year ago and government employed more people. It takes longer to process disability grants than other grants because of the process of medical assessment which involves staff with special knowledge and skills. Admin staff are not in the best position to interpret medical information. Disability grants are usually processed within 35 working days.
