AT RISK	VULNERABLE POPULATIONS
the chance or likelihood that a person may get HIV or TB. Certain circumstance or behaviours create, increase or continue risk.	groups of people who are most likely to get HIV or TB infection in certain situations or contexts. Social, cultural, political, legal and economic factors make a person more at risk of HIV infection and developing AIDS.

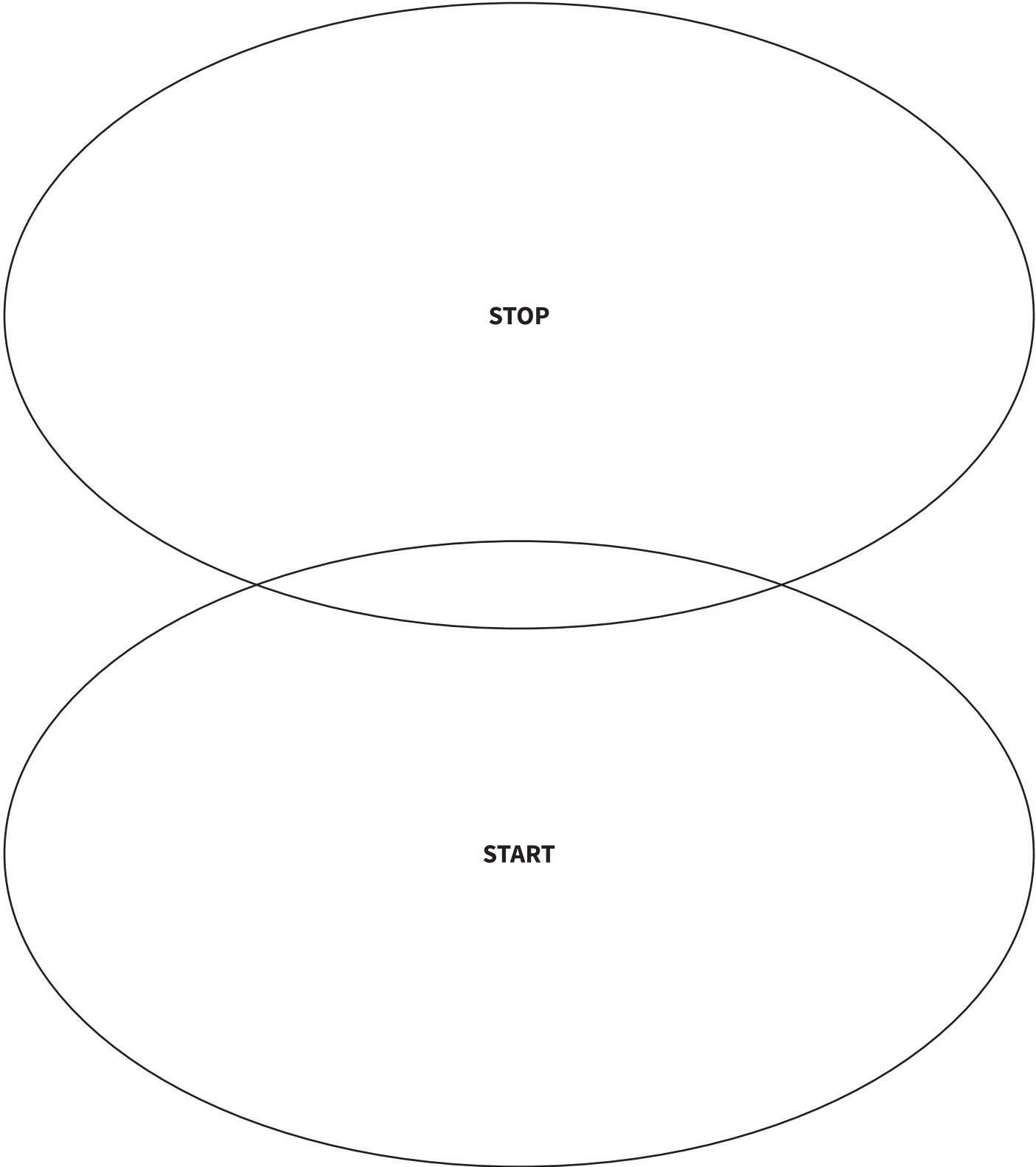
